Stage 3 Curriculum Overview - Term 3 2019

Welcome back to Term 3. I hope you had a restful holiday as another busy term begins.

Religious Education

The following units will be taught:

• New Testament - Stories of the Early Church

<u>English</u>

This term's writing focuses will be Imaginative Texts - Literary Description and Poetry. Reading skills, including comprehension and critical thinking, will be taught by exploring a range of factual and literary texts as a whole class and as part of a smaller instructional group. Spelling will continue to be taught as part of the reading and writing program. The whole school Public Speaking Program will be conducted this term with school finals being held early Term 3. Speaking and listening skills will be taught specifically through the Public Speaking program and through class discussions and presentation of research across the different KLA's.

Mathematics

This term we will be focusing on the topics of: Volume and Capacity, Mass, Data and Chance and Patterns and Algebra, as well as the ongoing operations of Addition and Subtraction and Multiplication and Division. Students will be grouped flexibly within the class and this will change regularly depending on the topic and their demonstrated understanding. There will continue to be a focus on mental computation strategies and problem solving.

Human Society and its Environment

This term we will be studying geography and the topic - "Factors that shape places." The students will explore how we influence the environment, how the environment shapes us and the specific case of bushfires.

Creative Arts

Our unit this term is 'Factors that shape places' tying in with our geography unit. The students will explore 'Where the forest meets the sea' by Jeannie Baker, as inspiration for their own artworks.

Music and Drama will be taught by Mrs McNally, on Wednesday.

<u>PDH</u>

This term our focus will continue to be 'The Leader in Me' as well as 'Keeping safe around drugs, water and environment'.

Mr Perez will facilitate specialist PE lessons on Wednesdays

The students will walk to Primrose Park on Tuesdays at lunchtime (weather permitting) to engage in physical activities.

<u>Italian</u>

Mrs Mercuri will teach Italian to the Seniors on a weekly basis.
