## From the Principal

This weekend is Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord. The Gospel reading this week is Saint Luke's



account of the Passion, beginning with the Last Supper then the arrest, questioning, sentencing, crucifixion and death of Jesus. It marks the beginning of Holy Week, the final week of Lent. How have those Lenten promises been going, the alms giving, prayer and fasting? Time to take stock of my efforts to change, improve; to be rid of what I don't like about who I have been and take action to be a better Christian, to become more fully human. The Passion is an account of great injustice, sacrifice, forgiveness and love. There are contrasting feelings of on one hand unworthiness and on another being unconditionally loved, a love that is bigger than I can imagine.

The following is a reflection from Fr Richard Leonard:

The reality is that Palm Sunday is not a yearly historical pageant. It is the day when we hear proclaimed that:

- our God knows what it's like to be heralded on Sunday and condemned on Friday;
- our God loved us so much that he laid down his own life so that we might live:
- our God showed us that the price of walking on palm branches is in the taking up of the cross.

And how do we do that? How do we face all the Calvarys of our world and be Christ-like?

In the Passion we are told that Jesus did five things:

- He healed the ear of the High Priest's servant;
- He spoke the truth to Pilate;
- He empathised with the women of Jerusalem;
- He forgave those who condemned him;
- He had compassion toward the other criminal being crucified.

And here's the rub: in facing our personal passion and being with those who face their Calvary we are called to do likewise.

If Holy Week means anything it means we end this week as we began it – processing. Walking away from inflicting pain to being a healer, desisting with lies and speaking the truth, resisting the temptation to judge and embracing empathy as our first response and, always and everywhere, being generous with forgiveness and compassion. No more and no less is asked of us if we are to follow 'the King of Love on Calvary'. (Fr Richard Leonard SJ)

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## HOLY WEEK TIMETABLE

AN ECUMENICAL PALM SUNDAY: This year for the fourth time we have the wonderful opportunity to enter into Holy Week with our brothers and sisters from Lindfield Uniting Church. At 10:00am (not 10:15am) on Sunday (Palm Sunday) 14th April. We will gather in the forecourt outside MacKillop Hall next to the school. From there we will process with our palms to the church while our brothers and sisters from Lindfield Uniting Church will then set forth to walk up the highway to their church on the corner of Provincial Road. Please be part of this wonderful beginning to Holy Week. Please note the earlier starting time of 10:00am (not 10:15am) – at this Mass palms will not be available after the blessing and procession has taken place.

CHRISM MASS (MASS OF THE HOLY OILS) On the Tuesday in Holy Week (16th April) the Mass of the Chrism will be celebrated at Our Lady of the Rosary Cathedral, 23 Yardley Ave, Waitara at 7:30pm. At this Mass the oils for baptism, confirmation, ordination, & anointing of the sick are blessed by the bishop, and the priests of the diocese renew their priestly commitment. As we do not have our new bishop, the Apostolic Nuncio, His Excellency Most Reverend Adolfo Tito Yllana, will be the principal celebrant of the Mass. Please try to come along to support the priests of our diocese.
