From the Principal



When Jesus takes Peter, James and John with him up on a mountain to pray, it was as though they were leaving earthly pursuits behind to be closer to God. In his book, 'The Heart of Christianity', theologian Robert Borg talks about 'a thin place where our hearts are opened' (Borg, 2003, p. 157). These 'thin places' are anywhere we feel a real connection and presence with God, a great sense of awe. I was in a 'thin place' at the birth of my children, but I have also found myself transported at times through music, quiet spaces, literature, family... Perhaps Peter, James and John shared similar feelings high on the mountain!

Fr John Frauenfelder's Words of Wisdom:

When the sun goes down, the natural world is plunged into darkness. The brightest light at night, out in the country, comes from the full moon. In ancient times, candles and torches lit the way for people after hours. Their shadows danced on the walls in the flickering light. As we imagine the story of Jesus' transfiguration, we can envision people in the nearby seaside villages looking up at the dark mountainside to see a bright light on the distant summit.

On the mountaintop itself, the disciples cowered in terror as the whole place lit up with impossible incandescence.

The Transfiguration of Jesus in today's Gospel was overwhelming because, like Moses, the disciples got a glimpse of God.

May our faith turn on the lights and illuminate Christ in our lives.

The story of the transfiguration, when Jesus appears in his true glory, is not an easy concept to grasp

the meaning of, even the apostles struggled! transfiguration is described in terms of the physical changes the StaffDevelsone apostles saw in Jesus. When we climb the mountain, spend time in the desert or wherever it is that we can separate ourselves from our daily lives and allow God to be present to us Friday we open ourselves up to being transfigured, changed, into someone even more beautiful than we already are! This transformation is what we can all aim for, especially during Lent. The challenge is to give ourselves permission, and make the time, to venture be in our own special 'thin places'!

Well-being Week and the National Day against bullying

This week has been Wellbeing Week at Holy Family. Each day the children have participated in activities which have been designed to "Sharpen the Saw" and develop not only positive thoughts and happiness but also positive relationships with others.

It is fitting that during this week we have also focused on the National Day of Action against Bullying. Today the children added a small touch of orange to their uniforms and over the week they have discussed and participated in lessons with this focus. Bullying can be a term we use quite loosely whenever something happens we don't like, so it is important to understand the term. Bullying is defined as an ongoing and deliberate misuse of power in relationships through repeated verbal, physical and/or social behaviour that intends to cause physical, social and/or psychological harm. It is not mutual arguments and disagreements; not liking someone or a single act of social rejection; one-off acts of meanness or spite or isolated incidents of aggression (from Bullying No Way website https://bullyingnoway.gov.au/). Needless to say these incidents do need to be dealt with but they don't constitute bullying as such.

We do not only teach about strategies around bullying and relationships in this one week, it is embedded in our PDH and Social Emotional learning programs K-6. In library lessons this term students have also been learning about cyber safety and cyberbullying and the importance of being respectful and caring for self and others online. 

- ⇒ And On Friday we folded origami animals.


