HOW CAN YOU HELP AT HOME?

- Learn high frequency words by playing games with them.
- Reinforce letters and sounds and encourage your child to have a go at sounding out words when writing.
- When your child is reading, encourage them to use different strategies for decoding an unknown word. For example, what would make sense in the story, look closely at the letters at the beginning and end of the word and check that the word fits into the structure of the sentence.
- Practise counting forwards and backwards to at least 20.
- Identify numbers in the environment.
- Ensure Home Learning is handed in on Thursdays.
- Reading: Read with your child EVERY NIGHT. Share their library book with them.
 - Take your child to the library.
 - Ensure they have access to a variety of reading materials.
 - Access Wushka readers online using the login details in the student's Home Learning Book.

TECHNOLOGY

The students will use the class computers/iPad during literacy groups and numeracy lessons. They will also be used to support learning in the other curriculum areas.
